RAG: RAISING AND GIVING

AberSU RAG (Raise and Give) is a single fund raised largely by Sports Clubs, Societies and Volunteering Groups but anyone can get involved! The fund allows Aberystwyth students to come together to fundraise and give their time to local and national causes.

AberSU RAG is split equally between three pots annually:

- **<u>A UK Charity</u>**: proposed and voted on by students at our Fresher's Fair in September each year.
- <u>A Welsh Charity</u>: decided by our Full-Time Officer Team in August each year.
- <u>The Community Fund</u>: distributed to local charities in Mid-Wales in the form of grants.

Alongside the training sessions, our club began to build valued friendships. After a semester of getting to know one another, we decided to introduce some interesting, themed socials every Wednesday evening.


SEA ROWING

culminated in the annual Broad Way's Film Festival - where a carefully selected collection of DIY student-created, written and performed short films were given the platform of the big screen in a free showing at the Aberystwyth Arts Centre cinema. Eager to keep the party going, the society has already announced plans for the return of the ever-popular One Acts Festival: where the creations of the society's most talented scriptwriters will be performed on stage - and they need the writers, directors, actors and stagehands to help make it happen.


